An ideal student in this class will spend the class time reading silently and seriously to help increase reading speed. She will also spend time on vocabulary study, as well as setting realistic reading goals and reflection of reading progress. Outside of class, the student will need to read regularly and often, so will need to be familiar with the extensive reading section in the library to be able to choose suitable books at her level. She will also make sure she completes the online reading quizzes soon after finishing the books chosen to read.				Students must do the in-class reading and vocabulary work, and keep clear records of their reading progress and vocabulary study. They need to do regular reading outside of class every week, and record progress with the online quiz system. They need to read the minimum required number of books at a level suitable for their understanding, but at the same time not too simple. They will also need to complete two class projects related to the books being read.
